We've done absolutely everything to put you at the centre of Middlesbrough's future.


As you've grown and developed and started to make your own way in life you've proved to everyone why Middlesbrough Children Matter.

What Middlesbrough can offer to you

Working at Middlesbrough is not only rewarding because of the experiences that you will have whilst at work, we also offer fantastic benefits for you to enjoy. These include:

 \cdot Pay - An excellent remuneration package with most roles on NJC terms & conditions

• **Pensions** - We are all at different points of our career but at Middlesbrough we support planning for the future with an excellent Local Government Pension with generous employer contributions and the ability to add to this with shared additional voluntary contributions.

 \cdot Holidays – Although we can't guarantee the weather when you are on annual leave we do offer a generous holiday entitlement starting at 193 hours (equivalent of 26 days minimum full time entitlement) with bank holidays in addition, and for those that enjoy their holidays additional leave can be purchased subject to approval.

• Being the best you can be - working with a highly visible and approachable leadership team, who are committed to a culture of learning and opportunity. Middlesbrough provide a relevant and dynamic training offer to all staff and enjoy strong learning relationships with partner agencies.

 \cdot Working Flexibly – After 2020 (a year like no other!) Middlesbrough are in a strong position working with staff to create ways that mean you can continue to work flexibly, included options of working from home where possible, flexi-time, part-time working and 9 day fortnights to name a few!

• **Trade Unions**- we are proud to work closely with our recognised Trade Unions and value the work they do, we encourage all staff to join one of the recognised Trade Unions that support with things like negotiating terms and conditions.

 \cdot Health & Wellbeing – we care about your physical and mental health, to try and support employees with this we offer staff a huge range of benefits, from discounted gym memberships to an Employee Assistance programme and face to face counselling service.
